



Edsel Stanton Sharrow

July 3, 1923 - October 26, 2021

Edsel Stanton Sharrow, age 98 of Traverse City, formerly of Filion, passed away peacefully on October 26, 2021.

Edsel was born July 3, 1923 in Filion, Michigan to the late Samuel and Mary Ann (Stanton) Sharrow.

He attended Church School prior to enlisting in the United States Navy on February 19, 1943. He served on the USS Phelps DD 360 as an Electricians Mate 1st Class. He was honorably discharged on December 4, 1945.

He married Idora M. Stirrett on November 30, 1954 in Beaumont, Texas. Ed and Idora raised their two daughters in Detroit and Roseville, while he was employed at Uniroyal Inc. for thirty six years. Upon his retirement in August 1978, he and Idora moved to the family farm in Filion, MI. Ed drove school bus for several years for Bad Axe School district. Upon selling the family farm, they moved to Bad Axe.

On May 22, 1999, Ed and Christine Rankin were married at the First Presbyterian Church in Bad Axe. Upon Christine's retirement, they moved to their present home in Traverse City, MI.

Ed loved to garden and gave away many vegetables to family and friends. He also loved hunting on his property with his brother-in-law, son-in-law and

granddaughter and grandsons. He was always happy being in the woods on his property.

He was a loving and devoted husband, father, grandfather and great-grandfather. Ed was a gentle man and a gentleman. His lasting influence can be seen in the faces of his family. He will be greatly missed by his family and friends.

Ed was very active in several Fraternal Orders, joining the Masonic Fraternity in 1957 at Roseville Lodge #522, transferring to Verona-Huron Lodge in 1985. He was Past Master and a 50 year Life Member.
